

#1 METRO

A coherent, cross-border transportation network is the backbone of metropolitan development. In the future, our mobility systems not only will have to meet multimodal, but also multi-optional demands. From the interlocking of different forms of mobility, to a smooth transition from walking or cycling to bus, train or car, the discussion is moving towards the general requirements of a successful interconnection of metropolitan areas. Discussing the future of metropolitan mobility means not only questioning existing mobility policy instruments and measures, but also encouraging sustainable and inclusive mobility as well as a territorial rebalance. By learning from other metropolitan areas such as Grand Paris, Barcelona and Madrid, we want to take on a multi-perspective view when talking about the planning and management of public transport systems in the Vienna Metropolis and shed light on how far mobility is an essential tool for creating new centralities and enables the development of new urban-rural lifestyles.

Ein kohärentes, grenzüberschreitendes Verkehrsnetz ist das Rückgrat von metropolitaner Entwicklung. Das Mobilitätssystem wird in Zukunft nicht nur multimodalen, sondern auch multioptionalen Ansprüchen gerecht werden müssen. Von der Verzahnung verschiedener Mobilitätsformen bis hin zu einem fließenden Übergang vom Gehen oder Radfahren zu Bus, Bahn oder Auto bewegt sich die Diskussion hin zu den generellen Anforderungen an eine erfolgreiche Vernetzung von Metropolen. Die Diskussion über die Zukunft metropolitaner Mobilität zu führen bedeutet, nicht nur bestehende mobilitätspolitische Instrumente und Maßnahmen zu hinterfragen, sondern auch nachhaltige und integrative Mobilität sowie ein territoriales Gleichgewicht zu fördern. Inspiriert von anderen Metropolregionen wie Grand Paris, Barcelona und Madrid wollen wir eine multiperspektivische Sichtweise einnehmen, wenn wir über die Planung und das Management der öffentlichen Verkehrssysteme in der Metropole Wien sprechen, und beleuchten, inwiefern Mobilität ein wesentliches Instrument zur Schaffung neuer Zentren ist und die Entwicklung neuer städtisch-ländlicher Lebensstile ermöglicht.


Exhibition Opening

Montparnasse Vibrations

FR 2005, 8min, Michaël Leymarie & Cédric Ramière

Montparnasse vibrations presents a specific perspective on different forms of the city in motion. It reads countless movements and the variety of its shapes to reveal its temporalities that can be segmented into rhythms and pulsations, routes and sequences, places, and objects. Time is used to measure and interpret complex movement and understand the set of different uses in space.


By revealing the temporal dimension of movement flows and working through them by repeating them, speeding them up or slowing them down, the Montparnasse station becomes a "center of exchanges". With almost 200.000 users a day the Parisian mobility hub displays a vibrant piece of urban architecture shaped by the interplay of space, time and moving bodies. Montparnasse is interpreted as a pulsating heart of the city: a nourishing organ whose beats determine the choreographies of our movements.



Trains of Thoughts A 2012, 60min, Timo Novotny

A portrait of several world metropolises through the lens of their subway systems, revealing power relations within the global economy: starting in Vienna, the film takes you on a journey through New York, Los Angeles, Tokyo, Hong Kong and Moscow.

Trains of Thoughts is a poetic audiovisual essay featuring an uninterrupted soundtrack by Sofa Surfers that mirrors constant movement and the rhythm of the rails, images, and lights that flicker by. The film reflects on the various fates, and the streams of consciousness generated in the non-places of the subway, and is witness to the social systems in these urban centres. Public transport not only plays a vital role in the functioning of an urban environment, it also represents a world in its own right that we become part of on a daily basis but rarely notice as such. This world contains millions of human stories, tragedies, comedies, and those that are somewhere in-between.






Metropolitan Walkshop

Grand Paris Express Alexandre Di Cocco, Project Manager in the Strategy and Innovation Depart-

ment of the Société du Grand Paris

The Grand Paris Express, one of the largest infrastructure projects in Europe, will profoundly change the structure of commuting in the metropolis and provide an opportunity to build station districts with an estimated total area of 14,000 hectares, i.e. one and a half times the size of Paris. The implementation of urban development projects around the future stations of the network will bring new opportunities in terms of mobility, urban quality and quality of life. Limiting the Grand Paris Express to the construction of a transportation infrastructure would therefore be to fail to understand the challenges that will accompany it and shap pe the future of the Paris region.



Barcelona's Metropolitan Avenues

Javier Ortigosa, Mobility-Urban Planner & Transport Researcher at Àrea Metropolitana de Barcelona (AMB)

Metropolitan areas are typically structured with networks of segregated roads and highways developed to provide a fast access to city centers. However, this fact has induced a substantial car traffic demand (the negative impacts of it are already well-known) and also has segregated urban areas and open spaces.

Barcelona's Metropolitan Area (AMB) is in the process of drafting a new metropolitan urban master plan (PDU) which, among other things, will define an urban structure composed of metropolitan streets and avenues to enhance social cohesion, livability, and a more sustainable mobility.



Intersectional Approach to Understanding Mobility

Floridea Di Ciommo, Transport Analyst, Co-Director cambiaMO\changing Mobility, Madrid

Personal factors such as age, gender, ethnicity and employment status strongly affect mobility behavior. This was made particularly clear by the COVID-19 pandemic. In order to protect the already vulnerable population groups, various efforts have been made to avoid pointless commuting and to encourage active mobility - especially walking and cycling. But very little has been done at the various administrative levels. Nevertheless, civil society initiatives and companies are taking new directions to rethink differential mobility needs and the general transport system. But to encourage active forms of mobility for everyone we will need to discuss the challenges of using an intersectional approach in transport research and pose possible solutions for policy makers.



Sustainable Airport City in a Post-Carbon Era

Michaël Leymarie, Architect and Urban Planning Expert in mobility and transportation infrastructure, ADP Ingénierie, Paris

Aren't we changing times, and taking the train of the Post-Carbon Era to fight global warming? The aviation industry will need time to replace obsolete aircraft fleets. While waiting for this metamorphosis, we propose to turn airports into multimodal platforms to organize the transfer of domestic flows to rail-based ground transportation. This will have the effect of reducing greenhouse gas emissions in the air and at airports, developing activity and ecological cities at the crossroads of air and land transport, and then mitigating the crises in the aviation sector to ensure the airport economy.




